	Academic performance – 99% of students have been tested for the state tests (AASA). One more student should complete testing this week. Other tests being completed soon are Galileo for $1^{st} - 8^{th}$ in math, 3^{rd} grade ELA, and DIBELS in ELA. Teachers are creating goals based on testing results.	
	Personnel – One Pre-K assistant has left PFS. Hiring will occur for a replacement for next year.	
	School safety – Covid and covid-like symptoms have been on the rise. Kelly Smith collected over 400 Covid test kits for families.	
	Additional – May Day celebrations will occur at Bushmaster Park with a picnic.

	Funding/Enrollment – With 190 as the student head count and 24 in K, we are looking at	
	basing the 2023/2024 budget on 178 instead of the 185 that we had this year.
